

RULES FOR ENTRY

- 1. A fee of 50p should accompany each adult entry. Surcharge of £1 per late entry which can only be accepted on the door from 9.00 to 9.30 am
- There is a registration fee of 50p PER CHILD, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN'S CLASSES ENTERED, which should accompany each child's entries. Children may enter adult classes on payment of 50p per class.
- 3. Exhibits should be the unaided work of the exhibitor.
- 4. Exhibitors may submit two entries per class in Sections 1-3, and one entry per class in Sections 4-7.
- 5. Exhibits **must** be staged in the competition tent between **9.00** and **10.00** am, when the tent will be closed for judging. Exhibits **must** be removed between 4.30 and 5.30 pm
- 6. The Committee cannot accept responsibility for any loss of, or damage to, the property of an exhibitor.
- 7. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and in the event of such refusal is not required to give any reason or explanation.
- 8. Cups must be signed for and returned to Sue Hill, Show Tent Secretary, Dutch Cottage, Clunbury (01588 660355) by Thursday 1st August 2013

PRIZES AND AWARDS

- 1. Adult classes: 1st £2 2nd £1.50 3rd £1 Children's classes: 1st £1 2nd 75p 3rd 50p Points are awarded for winning entries.
- 2. A perpetual trophy, to be held for one year, will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in each section. In the event of a tie the cup will be awarded to the competitor with the greater number of 1st prizes. After three consecutive wins a miniature presentation cup will be awarded.
- 3. A Certificate of Excellence will be awarded at the judge's discretion for any single exhibit of special merit.
- 4. Cup and prize winners may collect their awards from the show tent from 4.30 pm onwards.

SECTION 1 FLOWERS

Mrs J. F. C. Woosnam Flower Cup, Ted Lewis Cup for Roses and Margery Price Rose Bowl for flower arranging

Two entries per class permitted. Exhibits should be home grown except in classes 11 to 13.

- 1 A vase of perennials: seven blooms, one variety
- 2 A collection of flowers and foliage from your garden
- 3 Sweet peas: a vase of 12 blooms
- 4 One specimen rose
- 5 Hybrid tea or shrub roses: a vase of three blooms
- 6 Floribunda roses: a vase of three sprays
- 7 Dahlias: five blooms in a vase with or without foliage
- 8 Gladioli: one spike of any colour
- 9 A vase of annuals: seven blooms, one variety
- 10 A vase of mixed asters: seven blooms
- 11 A flowering house plant
- 12 A foliage pot plant
- 13 A cactus or succulent
- 14 A fuchsia

Flower arranging (garden or florist material permissible)

- 15 A table arrangement for a Diamond Jubilee Party, max. 12 x 18" (30 x 45cm) any height
- 16 A miniature arrangement in a cup, max. 4 x 4" (10 x 10cm) any height
- 17 An arrangement on an Olympic theme, max. 8×12 " (20×30 cm) any height

SECTION 2 HANDICRAFT

Dr Hamar Handicraft Cup

Any craft item may be entered and any medium used

Two entries per class permitted. Entries should be the unaided work of the exhibitor.

Two entries per class permitted. Max. mounted size for photographs 9 x 7" (23 x18cm). If possible, please submit photos with entry form no later than Thursday 23rd August 2012.

SECTION 4 COOKERY

Dr Hamar Cookery Cup and Monica Reynolds Cup for Cake Making

One entry per class only. All entries should be the unaided work of the exhibitor. All food must be home-made and home-baked. Cakes and biscuits should be presented on a large, flat plate or board with a doily, savoury items without doily.

- 30 A chocolate mayonnaise cake according to the recipe given below
- 31 A boiled fruit cake
- 32 A date and walnut loaf
- 33 A Victoria sandwich with plain caster sugar top and raspberry jam filling, baked in either one or two tins
- 34 A carrot cake
- 35 Three Jubilee cup cakes
- 36 Three fruit scones
- 37 Five millionaire's shortbread biscuits
- 38 A fruit tart on a plate (pastry top and bottom)
- 39 Five cheesy biscuits
- 40 A quiche, maximum diameter 8" (20 cm)
- 41 A loaf of granary bread
- 42 Three white bread rolls

Chocolate Mayonnaise Cake

10 oz (250g) self raising flour 8 oz (200g) caster sugar 1½ teaspoons baking powder 7 oz (175g) jar mayonnaise 4 tablespoons cocoa 8 fluid oz (240 ml) water 1 teaspoon vanilla essence

Fudge Icing

1½ oz (40g) margarine 1 oz (25g) cocoa 3 dessertspoons milk 4 oz (100g) icing sugar grated chocolate

Method

Set the oven to 180 C, 350F or Gas mark 4.

Put all the ingredients into a bowl and stir until mixed. Turn into a greased and floured deep 8 inch (20 cm) cake tin.

Bake for approximately 1 hour -when a sharp knife is inserted it should come out clean. Leave to cool in the tin then turn out and cover with fudge icing.

Fudge Icing

Melt the margarine with the cocoa and add the milk. Sift and stir in the icing sugar to make a spreadable mixture, adding more sugar if required. Decorate with grated chocolate.

One entry per class only. All entries should be the unaided work of the exhibitor. Jars and bottles should be of clear glass and free from commercial markings, lids also. Lids for jams should be either metal twist tops, plastic tops or cellophane covers; for chutneys and pickles plastic lined twist tops or plastic tops, cellophane covers should not be used. Presentation will be taken into account.
