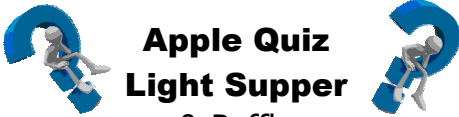

Experience the sights and sounds of Ravens gathering at dusk, on Sunday 12 February.

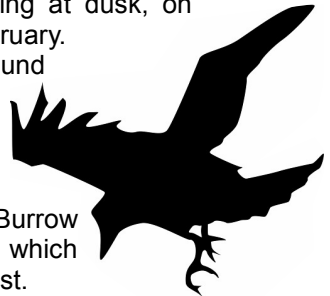
A 3-mile round walk will take you from Kempton to a vantage point opposite Burrow Hill Fort, below which the Ravens roost.

Ida's Idyll & Jill's Jaunt in Shropshire

Jill Gandy's mother, Ida (1885-1977), was the wife of Dr Thomas Gandy. In 1930, he became GP in Clunbury, where they lived until 1945. She was the author of children's books, including 'Under the Chestnut Tree' (1938) for which Clunbury provided the background. She also published books of history and reminiscence. It is said that, with the aid of villagers from Clunbury, she did BBC



broadcasts on Shropshire life. Diaries of her stay in Clunbury provided the material for her book of fond recollections: 'An Idler on the Shropshire Borders' (1970).

As reported in the 'Parish Post' of December 2011, Ida's daughter, Jill, with her friend, Jane, visited Barbara Freeman, Brian and Sandra Morgan and others. Following her visit, Jill sent the following email.

"It was so very nice to meet you in October. It brought back a whole lot of memories. We thought you might be interested in these photos—you will recognise where two of them were taken. My father is the clergyman with the top hat, and to his left on the photo is Harry Meredith. The other clergyman might have been the real vicar of the time, but

I'm unsure of that. [and what are they up to?] The photograph with my mother includes the school master - Mr Cooper?? [but which of the two?]



It is very nice to be included in the Parish Post circulation. I'm copying these photos in as they may be of interest.

We certainly hope to return to Clunbury before too long."

Family Research (part 2)

For those of you who are interested in the history of your house, or local area, the two main sources of information are the internet and the county archives. Here we are lucky to have the wonderful resource of very local information at the Bishop's Castle Heritage Resource Centre (BCHRC), which has duplicates of much of the material in Shropshire Archives (SA). Records include parish registers, census returns and details of field names. It also has an expanding library and a copy of the Victoria County Record series.

The census returns from 1911 back to 1851 are a good starting point: many local properties are itemised as individual buildings, particularly farms, isolated and large houses and those with specific use names e.g. public houses, malting and toll houses.

One less well known source of information (which can only be accessed on the internet) is 'A2A' or 'Access to Archives'. This provides a summary and full text of many records in the various county archives on the A2A web site. Searching the web site could not be easier – type in any house address, farm or field name or first name and surname and if the transcribed record is stored in any archive in England, it will show up.

What you see is a summary and full record of the document in modern English and details of the archive where the original is stored.

Field names are another interesting topic for research. Those with West Midland/Shropshire dialect names – quab, leasowe, slang etc, are easily checked using books available in SA and BCHRC.

Sometimes those with strange modern names such as the 'Babytree Lands' can be teased out but others, the Umbrella Fields for example, still remain a puzzle to me.

The Babytree Lands, an area between Brunslow and Hopesay, are called this in documents going back to the 17th century. However, in a transcribed document dated about 1280 the area closely matching the location is described as 'Babetrevorlonge'. It is easy to see how, over the course of a few hundred years, Babetrevorlonge became Babytree.

It is important for the amateur researcher to know the limits of his ability and so I contacted Swansea University who suggested that Vorlonge is an early English version of furlong and the Babetre portion is a family name, possibly Babbit.

Severn Trent, as a gesture of good will, parked a 9,000 litre water truck on our yard for the duration, and this was much appreciated by many of our neighbours as well as us, so thank you to them too. We are not throwing away the notes we made of where we could fill, however, in case the spring packs up again next year!

The Council are intending to make some provision for those on private water supplies in case a similar round of failures happens next year—but they are not sure where help should be provided. So if you rely on a borehole, well or spring and experienced any problem, whether total failure or partial failure or just grittiness, could you let us know. The Council are happy that this information remains anonymous and just your Parish will be noted, without a name, but by letting them know where problems were experienced this year, they can target standpipes more usefully for the future. Fuel Buying Scheme

The Community Council of Shropshire (SCC) has a new scheme that could reduce the cost of your domestic heating oil by making joint orders for the communities throughout Shropshire.

You need to join the scheme by paying an annual membership fee.

Annual membership fees

- Domestic: £20
- Community Building: £30
- Business: £100

Local co-ordinators will act as 'go-betweens' between the SCC and you. When you need oil, you place your order through the co-ordinator for your area.

The co-ordinator will tell the SCC each month how much oil the people in their village want to order, and then tell people when the oil will arrive and how much it will cost.

The SCC negotiates the best price from a range of suppliers. Your order increases their negotiating power, so once submitted, they regard it as binding.

Your local co-ordinator will advise you who the supplier is, the price per litre (exclusive of VAT, currently at 5%) and the approximate date of delivery.

You take delivery of the oil and pay the company.

The SCC are looking for local volunteers who will act as 'go-betweens'. In return they will benefit from free membership of the scheme.
