On the train from Craven Arms, with the posh hat in a carrier bag on the luggage rack, we made it down to London the day before the Garden Party at Buckingham Palace. Out for a stroll down Oxford Street in the late afternoon and we are no longer used to so many people around us. The traffic and noise are far from the quiet of the Clun Valley - even though there, it can be a noisy quiet with sheep, cattle and tractors. We did our bit for the London economy by a couple of taxi rides through the traffic jams.

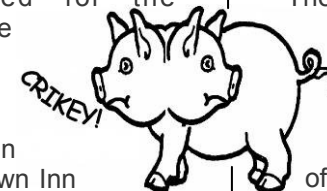
After a pleasant morning at the Natural History Museum we set off for the Palace. Traffic was heavy even at 3pm, but after a lengthy taxi ride we were dropped off by the Hyde Park entrance to the Palace and joined a queue to get in. Once through the security checks we strolled through the gardens towards the lawn.

There are over 200 magnificent trees, flowering shrubs and a rose garden, plus a famous 170 metres long herbaceous border. The garden is a nesting site for many native birds and the lake is a haven for water fowl, with the great crested grebe nesting on one of the islands. (cont. on page 2)

(cont. from page 1) Tea was served from large marquees and we were offered a cup of tea - or iced coffee, Sandringham apple juice or iced water. It certainly wasn't a day for cold drinks - the wind was strong and very cool. However it stayed dry, and the tea was delicious. Small sandwiches (no crusts), strawberry , raspberry and lemon tarts, chocolate mousse cake with a little crown on top, and other delicacies . Waiters were on hand to take your plate once empty and seconds were allowed!

The National Anthem announced the arrival of the Queen at 4pm, accompanied by The Duke of Edinburgh, Prince Andrew and the Duke of Kent. There were a small number of individual presentations to Her Majesty and then the Gentlemen at Arms arranged the crowd to form a lane for the Queen and members of the Royal Family to move through the guests. Their tea was served in the Royal Tea Tent - I couldn't quite see if they had the same as us. There were many military guests and a good number of clergy - including a few Bishops.

A wonderful day for people watching and the ladies fashions were very interesting. Some were quite astounding and as for the shoes - well some were quite unsuitable for the lawn and many a heel got stuck in the ground. I spotted one pair of gladiator style shoes worn with pink socks!!

The Royal Family left before 6pm - again with the crowd forming an orderly avenue - precisely 4 metres wide (we watched the Equerries pace it out). The National Anthem marked the end of a remarkable day, never to be forgotten. *Pat Harding*
