RULES FOR ENTRY

A fee of 50p should accompany each adult entry. **Surcharge of £1 per late entry which can only be accepted on the door from 9.00 to 9.30 am**

There is a registration fee of **50p PER CHILD, IRRESPECTIVE OF THE NUMBER OF CHILDREN'S CLASSES ENTERED**, which should accompany each child's entries. Children may enter adult classes on payment of 50p per class.

Exhibits should be the unaided work of the exhibitor.

Exhibitors may submit two entries per class in Sections 1-3, and one entry per class in Sections 4-7.

Exhibits **must** be staged in the competition tent between **9.00 and 10.00 am**, when the tent will be closed for judging. Exhibits **must** be removed between 4.30 and 5.30 pm

The Committee cannot accept responsibility for any loss of, or damage to, the property of an exhibitor.

The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry and in the event of such refusal is not required to give any reason or explanation.

Cups must be signed for and returned to Eirlys Ellams, Show Tent Secretary, Jasmine Cottage, Clunbury (01588 660625) by 1st August 2017.

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Adult classes: 1st - £2 2nd - £1.50 3rd - £1

Children's classes: 1st - £1 2nd - 75p 3rd - 50p

Points are awarded for winning entries.

A perpetual trophy, to be held for one year, will be awarded to the exhibitor with the highest number of points in each section. In the event of a tie the cup will be awarded to the competitor with the greater number of 1st prizes. After three consecutive wins a miniature presentation cup will be awarded.

A Certificate of Excellence will be awarded at the judge's discretion for any single exhibit of special merit.

Cup and prize winners may collect their awards from the show tent from 4.30 pm onwards.

Two entries per class permitted. Exhibits to be home grown.

- 1 A vase of perennials: five blooms, one variety
- 2 A collection of flowers and foliage from your garden
- 3 Sweet peas: a vase of 12 blooms
- 4 One specimen rose
- 5 Hybrid tea or shrub roses: a vase of three blooms
- 6 Floribunda roses: a vase of three sprays
- 7 Dahlias: five stems in a vase with or without foliage
- 8 Gladioli: one spike of any colour
- 9 A vase of annuals: seven stems, one variety
- 10 A vase of mixed asters: seven stems
- 11 An indoor pot plant

SECTION 4 COOKERY

Dr Hamar Cookery Cup and Monica Reynolds Cup for Cake Making

One entry per class only. All entries should be the unaided work of the exhibitor. All food must be home-made and home-baked. Cakes and biscuits should be presented on a large, flat plate or board with a doily, savoury items without doily.

- 33 A light fruit cake
- 34 A Marmalade cake
- 35 A Victoria sandwich with plain caster sugar top and raspberry jam filling, baked in either one or two tins

Sticky Toffee Loaf Cake with Fudge Icing

110g stoned dates

50g pecan nuts

110g spreadable butter

50g black treacle

175g golden syrup

150ml milk

2 large eggs

225g plain flour

1 level teaspoon mixed spice

2 level teaspoons ground ginger

1 level teaspoon bicarbonate of soda

Method

Chop the pecan nuts and dates

Melt the butter, black treacle and syrup gently. Allow to cool and mix in the milk.

Add the beaten eggs to the syrup mixture. Sift the dry ingredients together then gradually whisk in the syrup mixture to make a smooth batter.

Stir in the nuts and 2/3 of the dates and pour into a prepared 2 lb loaf tin. Drop the remaining dates on the top pushing them gently in with a skewer.

Bake for 1½ to 2 hours at 150 C (gas mark 2). Cool for ½ hour before turning out.

To make the icing

Melt the evaporated milk, butter and brown sugar together. Cool and add the sifted icing sugar. Whisk till smooth then spread over the top of the cooled cake.

For the icing

4 tablespoons evaporated milk

3 tablespoons dark brown soft sugar

50g butter

150g golden icing sugar

Lids for jams should be either metal twist tops, plastic tops or cellophane covers; for chutneys and pickles plastic lined twist tops or plastic tops, cellophane covers should not be used. Presentation will be taken into account.
